# Term 3 Week 10 2021

Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

I would like to thank our wonderful school community for everything you have done this term. One of my favourite quotes is "It takes a village to raise a child" and I have certainly seen how true this is at Garden Suburb Public School over the past 6 weeks. The staff have all worked collaboratively and tirelessly to make sure that students are able to continue learning at home and supervise the students who need to be at school. We have had grandparents, aunties, uncles and older siblings support our students to engage with their learning. Our parents are amazing, checking in on the wellbeing of our staff and continuing to ensure that their children are learning at home. The resilience and motivation of our students to continue with their learning during this time is commendable. It makes me very proud to work with such a great school community.

What next term looks like for us is dependent on NSW health advice, so we are planning to continue with Level 4 restrictions, unless otherwise advised over the holiday period. The roadmap for the return to school, depending on NSW Health conditions in the area, are below.

**Level 4:** Parents must keep children at home, unless there is no supervision for them at home. Minimal staff and students onsite. Students continue to learn from home. We will continue to provide work on Google Classrooms and booklets that can be collected from outside the office.

**Full Return (Level 3):** When areas are removed from stay-at-home orders all students will return to school with reduced mingling and on-site activities. This will involve timetable changes for break times and dedicated entry and exit points to the school for all students. Non-essential visitors are not permitted on school sites.

**Staged return (Level 3 plus):** When stay-at-home rules are still in place, but other community vaccination and transmission conditions are met, students return to school in a staged way:

- Kindergarten and Year 1 return from 25th October.
- Years 2 and 6 return from 1st November.
- Years 3, 4 and 5 return from 8th November.

As we head into the school holiday period, please take the time to recharge and enjoy the warmer weather that Spring brings. Our students have worked hard to engage with their learning and our staff are proud of them for doing this. It will be so lovely to see their smiling faces in person, but until then everyone will continue to see the smiles and have a laugh every school day on Zooms.



#### Just Like You program

On Wednesday 8th September, we celebrated Wellbeing and Diversity. The students were invited to join a special zoom presentation delivered by Variety – The Children's Charity. Thomas, our fabulous presenter had the students thoroughly engaged in the Just Like You program.

Variety's Just Like You is a disability awareness program designed to build understanding, acceptance and inclusion. Through celebrating



differences, developing empathy and creating inclusion, students learn that people with a disability are the same as everyone else – they are 'Just Like You'. The workshops were delivered by a professional facilitator who has a disability. Meeting and spending time with a person who has a disability helps to build empathy in children.

Our students demonstrated our core values of Respect, Responsibility and their Personal Best as they asked insightful questions and gave thoughtful answers during the workshops. This program was provided to school by Variety at no cost to the school and we would like



to thank Variety for the opportunity for all our students to participate.

He told me that as long as you understand what is going on than that is what matters the most it's not about feeling empathetic" – Charlotte

"The thing I enjoyed most was probably learning my name in sign language and Nas. Nas was amazing! Being able to listen and talk at the same time and not messing up is definitely an ability not all of us have. Considering she's blind, and not being able to read what is there to be said, having an American Accent probably to listen to would make it 10 times worse! 
