Our commitment to anti-racism education

NCCD

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. Sentral Access Codes

Each parent/carer requires an access code to access their child/s information in the Sentral Parent Portal. Parents receive a letter/email with one access code to start though please contact the office if you require more than one access code. We have noticed that a number of parents have set-up a Sentral parent portal account though they are not linked to a child using an access code.

You are able to request more access codes to suit your family. This gives all parents and carers the ability to view your child's information including attendance and academic reports, view notifications from the school, the ability to reply to permission requests, send absence notices, and message the class teacher.

Every Day Maths... #MathsTrainsBrains

With holidays just around the corner, what better time to start exploring the measurement concept of 'time' with your child. Here are some practical activities you can try during the holiday break...

- Talk with your child about converting between units of time. For example, 60 seconds is one minute and 60 minutes is one hour. How can they use this knowledge to help them create their playlist?
- Bonus activity: instead of creating a playlist of songs for a car trip, they could create a
 programming schedule for a family movie night including time for dinner and
 snacks.

Bonus activity: You could help them create a 10-minute playlist for the morning to get them get energised for the day, or a 15-minute tidying-up playlist for the

Car trip playlist

On your next road trip, let your child choose the music. But they have to create a playlist that lasts the exact duration of the trip.

The conversation

Here are some things you could discuss with your child:

- For example, as you are coming back from netball practice, talk about whether your plan was successful. Did you encounter any challenges like being stuck in a traffic jam, or being caught behind a tractor? Was there a queue at the bakery? Did Crandpa want to have a long chat?
- What would they do differently next time?
- You can also talk about things like. "If we know that it takes 3 minutes for us to buy bread, how could we describe that in seconds?"
- Have your child record the times that you need to do things by drawing a clock, and ask them to describe the time that each clock represents.

We started this week with making and enjoying some Johny Cakes and have continued with storytelling and a family breakfast. It was lovely to see our community coming together.


























Sentral Parent Portal App

Good for kids good for life Recipe: Banana Pikelets

Make these delicious pikelets to pack in the lunchbox or enjoy for breakfast or afternoon tea.

Prep & cook time: 15 minutes, Freezer Friendly

Ingredients

- 1 over ripe banana, mashed
- 1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour
- 🌢 l egg
- 3/4 cup milk
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence (optional)
- olive oil spray

Method

- 1. Sift flour into a bowl.
- 2. Add egg and milk and whisk until batter is smooth.
- 3. Add mashed banana and stir to combine.
- 4. Heat non-stick frypan on medium heat and lightly spray with olive oil.
- 5. Place heaped tablespoons of batter in the pan and cook for 2 to 3 minutes or until bubbles appear on the surface of each pikelet.
- 6. Gently flip and cook for another 1 to 2 minutes or until golden brown.
- Place pikelets on a plate lined with kitchen paper and continue to cook until no batter remains.
