Teachers will have time available over the coming 3 weeks to talk to parents who request a meeting time. Most of the meetings will be over the phone or zoom, unless the teacher requests a face-to-face meeting.

Communication

The school uses the Sentral Parent Portal platform as the main form of communication with our parents. It is important that you have downloaded the app. The school Facebook site is only used for sharing all the great things happening at GSPS as well as reminders about events.

School Uniforms

Over the next 2 weeks, we are focussing our PBL lessons on taking pride in your school with a focus on school uniform.

The uniform shop is open every Thursday from 3:10pm. Orders completed online can be collected from the uniform shop on Thursday afternoon or delivered to your child's classroom on Friday. School hats can be purchased from the front office. The uniform shop stocks new and 2nd hand uniforms.

UPDATED COVID-19 INFORMAITON FOR FAMILIES

The DoE has a current '4-week blitz' that is enhancing COVID-smart layers in schools. During this time, the school will be implementing some changes to ensure that we can continue to keep the community safe.

The Dunford Cup (Stage 2 and 3) and the **Zone athletics carnivals** will continue as planned this week. All students and staff travelling to the Dunford Cup must wear a mask on the bus to and from the grounds. There will be added sanitiser measures at these sporting events.

The Philip Green incursion on Wednesday 3rd August, will still go ahead. We have changed the format to avoid the crossing of cohorts and ensure that there is adequate room for social distancing with classes and cohorts.

We will be cancelling **whole school assemblies** for week 2 and week 4, as we cannot have these ensuring adequate ventilation and social distancing. The merit awards for students will still be presented in stage meetings.

The **public speaking** and **spelling bee competitions** will continue, however the interschool competitions may be held via zoom.

We will be continuing with plans for **Book Week in Week 6**. More information will be communicated to our families next week. This will include an opportunity for parents to join in the celebrations.

Household/close contacts attending school

Students and staff who are identified as household/close contacts and have no symptoms can attend school (excluding support units) if they follow certain guidelines agreed with <u>NSW Health</u> in addition to the <u>NSW Health</u> guidelines:

• You must notify the school (including OOSH if they attend this service) if they are intending to return under this provision.

• They should conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result each morning before attending school for 5 school days.

• Primary school students are recommended to wear a mask indoors (except when eating or exercising).

• No student or staff member identified as a household/close contact will be permitted to participate in overnight excursions.

Any visitor to a school site who is a household/close contact is required to advise the school that they are a household/close contact before they come on site. These visitors should conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result before attending. They must also wear a mask indoors at all times. The school will consider if the visit can be conducted virtually.

The department has determined that household and close contacts will not be permitted to return to a support unit (including Assisted School Travel Program) and will be supported to continue learning or working from home.

Note that staff and students who have had confirmed COVID-19 in the last 4 weeks do not have to comply with the following guidelines if they become a household or close contact and are not required to self-isolate or test unless they develop new COVID-19 symptoms.

If required the school will work with the department's Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing Case Management team around temporary use of additional COVID-smart measures for short periods of time based on localised risk assessments.

Testing

Staff and students cannot attend school if they are showing any symptoms of COVID-19. If symptoms occur at any time, your child should not attend school and should undertake a rapid antigen test (RAT).

• If a student is unwell and has any <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>, even the mildest of symptoms, they should always test for COVID-19.

• If the test comes back negative for COVID-19, the student should still not return to school until either: the student no longer has any symptoms, or a medical certificate is provided to the school confirming that symptoms are explained by another diagnosis (such as hay fever).

• It is important that students do not attend school if they are unwell, even if they have tested negative for COVID-19. Rapid antigen tests can produce false negative results and symptoms of other illnesses can also be similar to COVID-19, including flu, the common cold and stomach bugs. Health advice is that students who are sick should always stay home to rest and recover and avoid putting other students and staff at risk of getting sick.

It is recommended that students and staff that return to school after recovering from COVID-19 do not participate in rapid antigen testing for 4 weeks following release from self-isolation unless they develop new COVID-19 symptoms. This is due to NSW Health advice that people who have recovered from COVID-19 have a low risk of contracting it again in the following 4 weeks.

For positive COVID-19 cases

If there is a positive case in your child's class, year or other grouping, your child can continue to attend school in line with NSW Health advice.

If a student or staff member receives a positive RAT test, they need to:

• record the positive RAT result through the <u>Service NSW website</u> or <u>Service NSW app</u> – please add details of your child's school or early childhood education centre when prompted

• notify the school of the positive RAT or PCR test result as soon as possible

• follow <u>NSW Health advice</u> to isolate for 7 days.

Registering your child's positive RAT with Service NSW is a requirement of the Public Health Order and helps NSW Health track COVID-19 in schools and address any public health issues early on if required.

Negative results do not need to be reported to Service NSW or to the school.

The school will continue to inform their community when there is a positive case in the school and guide families on NSW Health advice, including monitoring for symptoms.

The regional finals will take place online between 29 August to 9 September. The winner of each division of each regional final goes on to the state finals. Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

During Weeks 4 -6 of this term, all Year 1 students will complete the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check. This is a short, quick assessment that informs teachers how your child is progressing in phonics.

Your child will sit with their class teacher and will be asked to read 40 words aloud. These words include 20 real words and 20 pseudo (nonsense) words. The assessment includes pseudo or nonsense words to see if the student is able to use their knowledge of blending to read a word rather than their memory of having seen that word before.

The test normally takes 5-7 minutes. If your child is struggling the teacher will stop the check. The check is carefully designed not to be stressful for your child.

If you have any further questions, please talk to your child's class teacher.





Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

Information for parents and carers

Phonics knowledge and skills are essential for learning to read and write. To be effective readers, students need to learn how to blend sounds together in words quickly so that they can read and understand the meaning.

About the assessment

The Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is a quick assessment that tells teachers how your child is progressing in phonics.

Phonics is important for students who are learning to read. This screening check observes how your child can read words with different letter combinations.

The main purpose of the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is to provide your child's teacher with information which will allow them to plan for your child's learning.

Each child is individually assessed by a teacher and all Year 1 students will be assessed.

Why is phonics important?

To be successful readers, students need to learn the code for the English language - the sounds represented by individual letters or different letter combinations - and the skill of blending these sounds together to read words.

It is important for students to develop quick recall of the sounds represented by different letters and letter combinations, to support successful reading.

Developing blending skills, which is the ability to blend together sounds to read words, is also important. Beginning readers need to learn how to blend sounds together in words quickly and fluently, so as not to disrupt the flow of reading and their comprehension of the text.

How will I support my child?

Children need frequent opportunities to practise and apply their developing phonics knowledge and skills. You may like to try some of the following activities at home with your child:

- Encourage your child to play games with letters such as bingo, snap or scrabble.
 Support them to say the correct sound represented by individual letters and different letter combinations.
- Practise blending the sounds in simple, one syllable words together. For example, by first pointing to each letter in the word cat and saying each individual sound 'c-a-t', then reading again by blending all the sounds together 'caaaaat', and finally reading the word nice and fast 'cat'. When your child is confident with blending 3 letters together, support them to blend and read 4 letter words like frog (f-r-o-g, fffrrrog, frog).
- Model being a word detective and point out special letter patterns found when reading with your child. For example words with a 'ch' sound on the end are sometimes spelt with the letters tch, like the words match, catch and hatch.
- Support your child's reading success by providing them with plenty of opportunities to practise their phonics knowledge and blending skills by reading decodable books together.
 Decodable books are written using words with letters that your child has learnt. Ask your child's teacher to suggest decodable books with the correct phonics focus for your child.
- When reading books encourage your child to look at the words and 'sound out' any unfamiliar words, blending those sounds together, from left to right, to read the word. This is the best strategy and more helpful than looking at the pictures to guess the meaning.

Empower your child by helping them understand money, its value and how to count it through the act of recycling...

Things you need

- Recyclable cans or bottles
- Access to a <u>Return and Earn container recycling exchange</u> II

The challenge

Step 1

Help your child gather together bottles and cans for recycling.



Step 3

Drop your items off at the Return and Earn depository and work how much money you've both earned.





Step 2

Once you have a decent-sized box of recyclables, talk with your child about how much money you estimate you'll earn by dropping these off at your closest Return and Earn depository.

Tip

Learning about money can be complicated for young children because they may not see it used often and the sizes of different coins do not give necessarily clues about their value. You can help your child by talking about how weird it is that the 50 cent coin is much bigger than the 1 dollar coin, but it is only worth half as much.

The conversation

Encourage your child to think of something they'd like to save money for - an item or an activity they want to do. Whether they are earning money by recycling bottles, doing jobs at home or helping around the community, you can help them understand how money works by supporting them to set a goal and work towards it. Each time they earn a little bit more, help them work out how much more they need to achieve their goals.




Sentral Parent Portal App

Choose small screen games and Apps that reduce kids sitting time and encourage physical activity.

- Choose videos, games or Apps that get your kids moving e.g. dancing, sports, yoga. Join in using the App or game with your kids
- Plan a walk using a digital map. Take photos of interesting things along the way
- Video your kids learning a new skill e.g. hopping, a new skateboard trick. Replay the video to track their progress over time
- Be a role model! Show your kids how to track their physical activity. Talk about how being active is fun & feels great! Show them how far you walked or swam last week!
