#### Student and staff absences

# Students going on holidays during the school term

If you are planning on travelling with your child/ren on a holiday during the school term, for 5 or more days, you will need to complete an application for extended leave – travel form.

Travel is considered to be domestic or international travel for the purpose of a family holiday, family business, bereavement or other reasons, which should be specified on the application.

If you are planning on travelling, you need to contact the school to discuss this and request an application for an extended leave – travel form.

The form needs to be completed and returned to the school with relevant travel information prior to the travel.

If the application is accepted, you will be issued with a Certificate of Extended Leave – Travel and the absences will be recorded as "Leave".

If a form is not submitted or accepted, then the absences will be recorded as "unjustified".

When travels period exceeds one school term access to Distance Education must be considered.

If you need support with this process, please contact the school and we will help you complete the forms.

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
# **NSW School Updates app**

The Department of Education's NSW Schools Parent App has replaced the NSW School Updates App. The new app has the ability for parents and carers with children in multiple schools to receive newsletters and updates within the same app and receive push notifications on their phones when newsletters and events are posted by the school. Information feeds are filtered by school year are customised for parents and carers and includes direct contact line details to the school. The app also includes a school website link to 'make a payment' and you will receive emergency updates such as school closures.

# Discovering what enables success for students in NSW public schools project

Our school has been invited to be part of the 'Discovering what enables success for students in NSW public schools' project. This project is conducted in collaboration with the University of NSW, the University of Canberra, Charles Sturt University and the NSW Department of Education. The project is part of the Ambassador Program in NSW public schools.

Over the coming week we will be sending home information to the parents of our Year 2-6 students about a student survey.

The project involves online surveys, focus groups and observations of staff and classroom programs.

# **Update to Award system**

This week we are informing parents of a change to the school wide award system. At a PBL meeting in Term 1, the teachers discussed the inconsistency with the attainment of the Gold Awards and from analysing data, there was only a small number of children achieving these over a school year. A decision was made to review the procedures for this. After a discussion at a P&C meeting that followed, the P&C gave input into a decision to make it possible for the majority of students to achieve a Gold Award during their schooling at GSPS.

The decision when taken back to the PBL team, was to continue the process of achieving a bronze, silver and gold award over more than one school year. There is further information in the newsletter regarding this. If you would like clarification about this, please contact the school.

# **Year 1 Phonics Screening Check**

During Weeks 4-6 of this term, all Year 1 students will complete the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check. This is a short, quick assessment that informs teachers how your child is progressing in phonics.

Your child will sit with their class teacher and will be asked to read 40 words aloud. These words include 20 real words and 20 pseudo (nonsense) words. The assessment includes pseudo or nonsense words to see if the student is able to use their knowledge of blending to read a word rather than their memory of having seen that word before.

The test normally takes 5-7 minutes. If your child is struggling the teacher will stop the check. The check is carefully designed not to be stressful for your child.

If you have any further questions, please talk to your child's class teacher.
