Carpark Works

The long-awaited works on the front area of the school and the carpark will begin on Monday 19th September 2022.

The works include removing the asphalt from in front of the office block, laying turf and adding a ramp to access the front office. The staff carpark will be undergoing works during the school holiday period.

All work is expected to be completed by the first day back of Term 4.

From Monday 19th September, the front gate on Prospect Road will not be able to be used until next term.

Staff will be on duty in the morning and afternoon outside the school gates to help with student drop off and collection.

We appreciate your understanding of this and your awareness of having more students using the side gate than normal when driving in the school zone area.

Morning entry to the school

Students will need to enter the school grounds in the morning using the side gate on Progress Place (near the hall). No students, except our support class students, are to enter through the carpark gates in the morning.

To avoid traffic congestion in Progress Place, we would request that if you usually drop off your child at the front of the school, continue to do this. Staff will supervise outside fence from 8:40am and direct students to the side gate on Progress Place once they have crossed the road using the school crossing.

Afternoon exiting the school

In the afternoon, students who usually leave through the front gate on Prospect Road, will be able to leave through the staff car park gate to meet parents outside the school fence.

Alternatively, you can arrange to meet your child at the side gate on Progress Place, however please make sure your child is aware of this change if they normally meet outside the front of the school.

Support unit students will continue to meet the support unit staff at the front of the school in the mornings and will use the carpark gate to enter the school with the staff.

In the afternoon, staff will walk the support unit students out to their usual meeting place.

Attending the office during the school day

If you need to come into the office during the school day, please enter via the staff carpark gate. The gate will be closed but not locked. There will be information on the gate so you can open it and there will be signs to help you get to the office.

We apologise for any inconvenience that this may cause and are looking forward to having the works completed.

We love that Caitlin has taken the initiative to organise this donation for such a wonderful charity helping women who do it tough.





- Costa will be looking for creativity, sustainability and plant quality in the displays.






